Doctor's Corner:

External Parasites



When the weather warms up, and it certainly has, we see many more cases of **flea and tick infestation**. As common as these critters are, it is important to remember that they are potentially a serious health risk to your pets as well as your human family members. **The importance of prevention cannot be overstated.** The health risks from fleas and ticks are listed below.

Ticks can cause anemia and a type of paralysis in dogs and carry and transmit the organisms that cause Ehrlichiosis, Lyme, and Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever, which people can also get from ticks. They can also give dogs Relapsing Fever, Hemobartenellosis, Babesia, Hepatozoonosis, and Tularemia. Cats can get Cytauxzoon, Relapsing Fever, Ehrlichia, Q Fever, Tularemia, and Hemobartonellosis. Pretty scary!!!

Fleas commonly cause a severe skin allergy, anemia, and tapeworms in both dogs and cats but they also are part of the cycle for Cat Scratch Fever in humans. And...believe it or not *The Plague* (that's right: the plague as in bubonic plague!) in both cats and humans.

We recommend a **year round prevention** program for all cats and dogs for fleas and ticks (as well as mosquito carried Heartworm Disease). Please speak to one of our vets if your pets are not fully protected from these common but serious pests!

Big Changes: Done!


